When we join Gamma Sigma, we pledge to attend and participate in meetings. Reservations are critical to the success of each of our dinner meetings. Your reservation does more than ensure you have a meal. It is used by the hostess committee in planning for favors and set-up. The president often wants to know how many are attending to plan for any materials she may be distributing. Often, speakers want this same information. Consequently, it is important you respond to your reservation email.

Approximately two to three weeks prior to the meeting, the hostess chair contacts a caterer. The caterer gives her a date that he/she must know the number planning to attend the meeting. When the hostess chair has the menu and this deadline, she then sends an email to the reservation chair, Debbie Adam. Debbie sends emails to all other reservation committee members with the meeting details, as well as the menu and a deadline for responding to her with those who plan to attend. (This year's reservation committee includes Linda Shaeffer, Tiffany Shaeffer, Kim Mautz, ,Kathy Young, Linda Geyer, and Shirley Clark. Watch your email for a contact from one of these ladies!) The chair then compiles the list of those planning and unable to attend, and forwards it to the hostess chair for use at the meeting.

Sometimes members forget to respond to the emails or an emergency occurs and a cancellation needs to be made. If either of these occur after the date for response in the email you receive, please contact the hostess chair for that meeting. After the deadline, she is the most direct contact for adding to meal numbers or cancelling a reservation. Do not contact the reservation chair. She does not deal with the caterer and cannot tell you if you may attend the meeting or if you are able to cancel the reservation. Please remember: if you are unable to cancel a reservation you have made or have to miss the meeting, YOU are responsible to pay for the meal. The group cannot assume these costs. Also remember that although you may have missed the deadline for a meal reservation, you may still come for the meeting itself. You are always welcome.

Rustic Rummage Rewind


Last year our first Rustic Rummage was a success. It provided the money we needed to fulfill our annual Grant-in-Aid to a Perry County high school senior.
